- Serves 236 Students with Severe Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Severe Cognitive Impairment (CI), and Severe Multiple Impairment (SXI)
- 19 School Age Classrooms (3-26 years old)
- 5 Early Childhood Classroom
- Placement of Students is based on level of support needed (Level 1 is lowest support and Level 3 is highest support)
- 65% of Students have Autism




Classroom Breakdown

- Kick off to the month with Core Vocab Assembly





Started with Read It Once Again Binders


Each Book has a binder and bag with activities and manipulatives




